Personal and Emotional

'I didn't realise how tough I needed to be. I would have taken the easy way out, but I learned to stand up for myself. My partner hated it!'

'There were times when I wanted to end everything. If I hadn't been supported, I wouldn't be here today.'

'It was hard watching videos, reading blogs and books which showed me what was really happening. I lived a lie for so long that I found it hard to adjust my thinking and emotions.'

'My advice? Get away from the narcissist and discover who you really are. Afterwards, nothing of the narcissist or their empty, material world will be appealing.'

'Don't lose hope!'

'There is a time when being selfish and putting yourself first is right. I felt like a butterfly must feel when breaking free of its chrysalis. It was slow and painful. Then I broke free. After shock and trauma, I spread my wings and learned to fly, even though it was scary.'

Relationship with a Narcissist

'I found it hard accepting that a person I thought I knew was really a total stranger and a fraud. I have lost years of my life.'

'I wanted to believe the best about them, but I learnt that there was nothing good to believe.'
